Technology

Safety Online

On Monday you will receive May's Online Safety Newsletter. We would particularly like parents to read and action the section titled "What apps and games are suitable for my child?" There is a useful pictorial aid to guide you as a parent to implement tight control over your child's access to inappropriate content. Mrs Trundley led an assembly with Year 5/6 after some parents raised concerns over inappropriate messaging and group calls outside of school hours. Very clear messages were given and children were acutely aware that the apps that caused the problems are all suitable for 13 years and above. This includes facebook, messenger, whats app and snapchat. Whilst our children want the independence a phone can give, they are perhaps not all emotionally ready or resilient for the wider uses of devices. Teachers and all school staff will continue to teach our children how to stay safe online. We hope that this helpful app guide will support parents in introducing firm control over their child's access.
