Behaviour

A Positive Culture of Respect and Belonging

At Westmoor, we are incredibly proud of the behaviour and attitudes of our children. Visitors to our school frequently comment on the excellent manners they observe and the calm, purposeful atmosphere throughout the building. One recent initiative that has contributed to this is our introduction of "Wonderful Walking"—a simple but powerful approach that ensures children move around school calmly, safely, and with awareness of their surroundings and each other. Each morning begins with a warm welcome. Staff greet children personally with smiles, handshakes, and kind words, setting a positive tone for the day ahead. Our staggered start allows time for meaningful connections between children and their class teachers or support staff, helping to build strong, trusting relationships early in the term.

Our **Positive Behaviour Policy** is rooted in the belief that children thrive when their efforts and kindness are noticed and celebrated. We focus on "catching children being good", using praise, incentives, and recognition to reinforce positive choices. This term, we've begun introducing **Recognition Boards** in classrooms and plan to highlight those who go above and beyond, and we're excited to develop this further.

We truly see ourselves as *The Family of Westmoor*—a community where everyone belongs, and where we look after one another with kindness and care.

Addressing Unacceptable Behaviour

While the vast majority of our children consistently demonstrate excellent behaviour, we are also committed to addressing any incidents that fall short of our expectations. We have recently refined how we record incidents using our electronic system, CPOMS. If a child physically hurts another child and it is not accidental, this is recorded as **peer-on-peer assault**.

After reviewing our records for the first four weeks of term, we have noted a higher number of such incidents than we would expect. I have spoken to all children in assembly to reinforce a clear message: hurting others is never acceptable. Children have been reminded that if someone hurts them, they must tell an adult immediately. We have also made it clear that retaliating by hitting back is not acceptable and will also be recorded as peer-on-peer assault. To support this, we have a strong adult presence during break and lunchtimes, with staff wearing high-visibility jackets or waistcoats so they are easily identifiable. Play fighting is not permitted, as it often leads to real harm and confusion.

Next Steps and Support

If an incident of peer-on-peer assault occurs, parents will be informed via email using a standard letter. In cases of repeated incidents, parents will be invited to meet with the Head Teacher or Deputy Head Teacher to discuss how we can work together to support the child in making better choices.

Consequences for such behaviour may include the loss of privileges, such as missing playtime to reflect on actions. In more serious or repeated cases, a child may be placed in **internal exclusion**, where they will complete their learning in another classroom or with a senior leader.

We understand that some children may have additional needs that impact their behaviour. In these cases, we will work closely with families to provide tailored support and set clear, achievable targets for improvement. for future reference.

Please make note of the OOSC telephone number should ever you need to contact them during opening hours. You will also receive electronically a list of foods purchased and full ingredients.

Please check this carefully and inform staff if your child cannot eat any of the foods.

Our goal is always to work in partnership with parents to promote kindness, respect, and a safe, happy environment for all. Together, we can ensure that Westmoor remains a place where every child feels valued, supported, and ready to learn.
