






Click on the picture to read an article by National Online Safety on Livestreaming and dangerous chat rooms. This is a current issue being seen across schools.

eAWARE

Just before the summer, we asked all parents (KS1-KS2) to participate in our online safety survey. We also surveyed our children. From analysis of the data from the start of the year to the end we saw a great improvement in children and adults' knowledge of online safety. Here is the result of our parents data from Summer 2022.



As you can see, 62% of parents demonstrated a poor understanding of the online risks their children may encounter.
