Free School Meals and Daily Milk

Reception to Year 6

All children from Reception to Year 2 can access a free school meal each day and register to pay for milk daily. However, if you think there is any chance that your child/children may be eligible for free school meals due to being in receipt of any of the below, then please apply through the following link. Your child will receive free school meals and milk every day until the end of their time in primary school (Y6).

- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) Furthermore, the pupil premium funding that school receives from your successful application is used to support your child throughout their school life.
